

COVID-19 Update

Since March, the Collin County Livestock Association has been monitoring COVID-19 guidance released by the CDC and the Collin County Health Department. After careful consideration and due to the continued uncertainty of conditions come January, the Collin County Livestock Show will modify its daily schedule and will move forward with the show under this plan. CCJLA based its decisions on the following: safety and health of our exhibitors, families, and staff.

The Collin County Livestock show has been approved for a capacity set at no more than 1,000, this includes exhibitors, advisors, park staff, and supporters. In order to comply with this, the county show will have a wristband policy in place. Wristband will be available for purchase through the online entry program and a limited number will be sold at the door each day until our capacity is hit.

- All exhibitors, advisors, vendors/park staff will be given a wristband for the week
- Families may purchase a maximum of 2 additional wristband
 - Wristbands will be delivered to the chapter/club advisor
 - Wristbands will be coded for specific day/species
 - Additional wristband will be limited and available each day at the door

The planned activities at the show will comply with CDC guidelines, and will adhere to any health and safety orders enacted by local, state, or federal agencies. Health and safety for all involved remains the top priority for the Collin County Livestock Association. This includes, but is not limited to, requiring face coverings, additional sanitization of high-touch areas, and social distance precautions.

Per Governor Abbott's Executive Order 29, dated July 2, 2020. Every person in Texas shall wear a face covering over the nose and mouth when inside a commercial entity or other building or space open to the public, or when in an outdoor public space, wherever it is not feasible to maintain six feet of social distancing from another person not in the same household; provided, however, that this face-covering requirement does not apply to the following:

- any person younger than 10 years of age;
- any person while the person is consuming food or drink, or is seated at a restaurant to eat or drink;
- any person while the person is giving a speech for a broadcast or to an audience.

Wristbands will be sold as follows for \$5 each, excluding advisors and exhibitors.

- Saturday, January 2nd
 - Rabbit Show
 - Poultry Show
- Monday, January 4th
 - Shop Show
 - Swine Show- 2 day pass
- Wednesday, January 6th
 - Sheep/Goat show- 2 days pass that will expire 1 hour at the completion of the Sheep Showmanship
- Thursday, January 7th
 - Steer/Heifer Show- 2 day pass that becomes valid at 4pm
- Friday, January 8th
 - Horticulture Show
